## MARCH 1, 2021

Chairman Helgevoild called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoild. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of February 22, 2021 were read and approved.

Approved claims for payment. Sandy McGrath with Public Health gave an update on the COVID cases in Wright County. There is currently 1,731 cases since March 2020. Wright County will be getting around 1,100 Johnson & Johnson vaccines. Wright County is one of 17 counties in the state that will be getting this vaccine.

There is a correction to the February 22nd minutes. It was reported that there were 1,761 COVID cases in the County since March 2020 and should have been 1,727.

Dean Kluss gave an update on the Agribusiness Park water supply. Kluss has been in contact with the Operations Manager on what needed to be done yet. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve the Notice of Acceptability of Work as presented by ISG on the Water supply and approve the final pay estimate #6 to Beemer Companies in the amount of \$38,407.30. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to accept the resignation of Carol Ganzefeld as the Liberty Township Clerk and appoint Kathy Fletcher as Liberty Township Clerk with a term to expire December 31, 2022. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the liquor license for the Nine and Dine in Eagle Grove. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the hire of the two names provided pending pre-employment physical/drug screen and background check. The first position will be for the Truck Driver – Dows Maintenance Facility at a starting wage of \$22.29 per hour. The second position will be the Patrol Operator – Belmond Maintenance Facility with a starting wage of \$22.87 per hour. Motion carries unanimously.

Clemons then presented Resolution 2021-12 on awarding contract for Project FM-C099(96)-55-99 consisting of HMA Pavement Resurfacing with milling. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve Resolution 2021-12 on awarding contract for the C20 project. By roll call vote: Ayes – Rasmussen, Kluss, and Helgevoild; nays: none. Motion by Crees, second Sorensen to approve Gary Sheet's building permit to put up a garage. All ayes. Motion carried.

Vacancy on the Council was discussed. Council plans to appoint a Council Member to fill the vacancy at the Council Meeting April 12, 2021.

In the loss of Council Member Whyte, the vacancy of the Landfill and Emergency Management meetings needed to be filled. Council Member Petersen will begin attending the Landfill meetings starting March 17th and Mayor Fiscus will attend the Emergency Management meetings.

Introduced and moved by Sorensen, second Meinke, Res#750 to approve the FY 2021-2022 Budget. There were no written or oral objections presented. Approved by a roll call vote. Ayes: Sorensen, Meinke, Crees, Petersen.

Discussed the water tower and how to fund what needs to be done. Chris Janson with MSA, was contacted and will be at April 12th's Council Meeting with details.

Motion by Crees, second Meinke to schedule Clean Up Day for May 8th. All ayes. Motion carried.

Delinquent utility bills were discussed in detail.

Motion by Sorensen, second Crees to approve the payout of Dakota City Clerk, Angelique Berry in the amount of 952.50 for the assistance she has provided to the City Clerk. All ayes. Motion carried.

Reminder to Goldfield residents starting in April Council meetings will begin at 7 p.m.

Motion Meinke, second Petersen to adjourn at 7:05 p.m. Gabe Fiscus, Mayor Kathy Nelson,

Gallentine reached out to three (3) Drainage Contractors that have a long reach backhoes in Wright County and received one (1) estimate from Maier Trenching out of Eagle Grove, IA. Maier Trenching provided a \$40,000 estimate to do bed shaping due to deep cuts in the drainage ditch.
