FICATION OF THE HEART OF IOWA REGIONAL HOUSING TRUST FUND

WHEREAS, Webster and Hamilton Counties have created the Heart of Iowa Regional Housing Trust Fund (HIRHTF), and it is an established Local Housing Trust Fund (LHTF) whose general mission and purpose is to address the affordable housing needs within the region through coordination and

long-term planning; and, WHEREAS, it is important for the area's communities and counties to collaborate to address this issue;

WHEREAS, Homeward, Inc. will no longer serve as an established LHTF for Calhoun, Humboldt, Pocahontas, and Wright Counties upon completion of the 2022 funding year; and, WHEREAS, joining a LHTF, that is certified by the lowa Finance

Authority to receive funding, would

allow the displaced counties to continue to assist families under the State Housing Trust Fund; and, WHEREAS, beginning January of 2023, the State Housing Trust Fund dollars will be administered by HIRHTF under the direction of its Board of Directors, and HIRHTF staff will provide day-to-day management that targets the needs
