## Wright County Board of Supervisors July 25, 2022

Chairman Rasmussen called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Helgevold, and Rasmussen. Minutes from the previous regular meeting of July 18, 2022 and special meeting of July 20, 2022 were read and approved.

Motion by Helgevold and seconded by Kluss to approve Resolution 2022-32 to create the local government opioid abatement fund. By roll call vote: Ayes – Kluss, Helgevold, and Rasmussen; Nays – none. Resolution 2022-32 duly passes and reads as follows:

## RESOLUTION 2022-32 CREATING THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT OPIOID ABATEMENT FUND

WHEREAS, in 2018, the County Board of Supervisors authorized Wright County to enter into an engagement agreement to pursue litigation against certain manufacturers, distributors, and retailers of opioid pharmaceuticals in an effort to hold the opioid defendants financially responsible for the impact of

the opioid epidemic on the County and resources necessary to combat the opioid epidemic:

WHEREAS, negotiations with the settling defendants have resulted in proposed nationwide settlements of state and local government claims in the litigation;
WHEREAS, every participating

local government that receives a direct distribution amount shall create a separate fund on its financial books and records that is designated for the receipt and expenditure of the entity's direct distribution "LG Abatement amount called Fund." Funds in the Local Government Abatement fund shall not be commingled with any other money or funds of the participating local government. A participating local government may invest LG Abatement Fund funds consistent with the investment of other funds of a participating local government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED that a special revenue fund be created called "LG Abatement Fund" (01030) for the purpose of receiving the dollars from the settlement agreements. The budgetary fund shall be subject to standard county accounting practices and policies. The balance in the LG Abatement Fund shall be held as a restricted fund balance pursuant to the county's Fund Classification Policy. All revenues and expenses starting with 2022-2023 fiscal year shall be accounted for in this fund.

Resolution declared adopted on July 25, 2022.

Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, presented Resolution 2022-33. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Helgevold to approve Resolution 2022-33 for participation in SS4A grant application. By roll call vote: Ayes – Kluss, Helgevold, and Rasmussen; Nays – none. Resolution 2022-33 duly passes and reads as follows:

## RESOLUTION FOR PARTICIPA-TION IN SS4A GRANT APPLI-CATION

Wright County Resolution No. 2022-33

WHEREAS, as part of the new

Federal Transportation Bill, Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), there is over \$1B of roadway safety funding available in the form of Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grants. To be an eligible applicant for this new safety funding, a county MUST have an eligible Action Plan in place; and

WHEREAS, the lowa County Engineers Association (ICEA) plans to apply for a SS4A grant to develop and supply all 99 counties in lowa with an eligible Action Plan at no cost to the counties. ICEA encourages all 99 counties to participate in this grant application; and

WHEREAS, the Wright County Board of Supervisors will commit to achieve significant declines in roadway fatalities and serious injuries in Wright County; and

WHEREAS, the Wright County Board of Supervisors recognizes the Action Plan and will assist the County Engineer's department in achieving the goal of a dramatic decrease in roadway fatalities and serious injuries and zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries by the years 2030 and 2050, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the Wright County Board of Supervisors, after consulting with the Wright County Engineer, desires to participate in a joint SS4A grant to develop and receive an eligible Action Plan for Wright County.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVI-SORS OF Wright COUNTY that this County does hereby request to be included in the statewide SS4A grant to develop Actions Plans for all 99 counties in lowa.

Resolution adopted this 25th day of July, 2022.

Motion by Helgevold and seconded by Supervisor McVicker from Franklin County to approve the payment to Maier Trenching in the amount of \$67,800. Motion carries.
