MAY 26, 2020 Chairman Kluss called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Helgevoold, Rasmussen, and Kluss. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 18, 2020 were read and approved. Approved claims for payment. Heard an update on the COVID-19 surveillance testing. The county will continue to do the surveillance testing of the larger employers. Of the positive tests coming in this past weekend, they were all asymptomatic. Wright County has 123 positive cases of COVID-19 throughout the time of the pandemic. Held a conference call with Brian at Reilly Construction, Eric and Kelly with ISG Engineering. Brian gave update on progress from last week. They did get the tiles connected by the well house and said that it worked really well. Kelly gave an explanation on the pads for change order #3. Kluss does not feel that the county should be responsible for paying for the 3 days on the wait due to the ground not prepped and they did not notify the county of the issue. Also, paving on the East half of road is not done yet due to the continual rain. Cindy Litwiller, Wright County Economic Development Director, requested approval of the Promissory Note between Wright County Economic Development and Clarion Economic Development Corporation as a small business loan to provide immediate and necessary assistance to small businesses who may be adversely affected by COVID-19 pandemic. This note will be 25,000 for a period of 15 years at zero percent interest. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to approve the promissory note with the Clarion Economic Development Corporation. Motion carries. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to appoint Donna Brown to the Wright County Conservation Board for another 5 year term ending June 30, 2025. Motion carries. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to appoint Lisa Kluss to the EMS Board with no term limits. Motion carries with Kluss abstaining. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to approve the authorization of Dean Kluss and Betty Ellis to work with the Farm Service Agency on the county owned farm operations and have the

Chairman sign the letter. Motion carries. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to approve the authorization of Eric Rector as Wright County Conservation Director to take care of all matters pertaining to the Wright County Conservation property with the Farm Service Agency and Natural Resource Conservation Service offices and have the Chairman sign the letter. Motion carries. Motion by Helgevoold and seconded by Rasmussen to approve the 2020 Drainage District levies. Motion carries. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to approve the joint drainage district levies with Franklin, Webster, and Hancock counties. Motion carries. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to approve the proposal from Gardiner & Company to do the 2020, 2021, 2022 fiscal year end audits. Motion carries. Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, presented the name of an applicant for the Secondary Roads Office Manager. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to approve the name provided with a starting wage at 45,000.00 with a 6 month review. Motion carries. David Johnson, Wright County Drainage Attorney proposed that the Drainage District Trustees to go into closed session. Motion by Helgevoold and seconded by Rasmussen to go into closed session following Iowa Code Section 21.5(c) to discuss strategy with counsel in matters that are presently in litigation or where litigation is imminent. By roll call vote: Ayes - Helgevoold, Rasmussen, and Kluss; nays - none. Went into closed session at 11:00 a.m. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to go out of closed session at 11:35 a.m. Motion carries. Motion by Helgevoold and seconded by Rasmussen to authorize Dave Johnson to be our counsel and defend all of the plaintiffs in case of EQCV02487 filed in Wright County. Motion carries.
