Chairman Kluss called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoid.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoid to approve the tentative agenda. Motion carries.

Minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 22, 2023 were read and approved with one correction.

Approve claims for payment.

In open forum, Leroy Jensen discussed the tax rebates for Pre-stage and ReNewTrients. Jensen also asked about the Public Health building being renovated. Helgevoid mentioned that renovation will be paid with ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) dollars and not taxpayer dollars.

Bob Ritter also spoke in open forum about the ReNewTrients tax rebate.

Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve an amount of up to \$300.00 for Kristina Paradise, Senior Construction Tech for Snyder & Associates, to attend the PHMSA (Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration) meeting. Motion carries.

Motion by Helgevoid and seconded by Rasmussen to use the LATCF (Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Fund) funds to pay any outstanding plus this years drainage district assessments for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife. Motion carries.

Tonee Nicholas, Wright County

Assessor, presented the Property Tax Exemptions for Slough Bills. There were 2,924.12 acres last year and this year will be an estimated 2,900 acres. Motion by Helgevoid and seconded by Rasmussen to approve the Slough Bills as presented with one being disallowed. Motion carries.

Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, gave an update on the Secondary Roads. There were 9 work orders completed last week. Blades continue to prep and level rock miles as the trucks haul them. The blades were pulled last Tuesday from normal blading operations due to dry conditions. Crews hauled 500 tons of rock to 310th Street after the completion of the rehab/reclaim to the road. Jared Beecher will move from Eagle Grove Patrol Operator to Sign Maintenance in the Clarion Bridge Shed. This will leave an opening in the Eagle Grove Maintenance Shed for a Patrol Operator.

Held the first reading of Resolution 2023-23. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoid to approve the first reading on declaring Emergency Medical Services (EMS) an essential service in Wright County, Iowa and appoint Wright County EMS System Advisory Council. Motion carries.

Motion Helgevoid and seconded by Rasmussen to adjourn the meeting. Motion carries.
