#### **Wright County Board of Supervisors** May 30, 2023

Chairman Kluss called the reqular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevold. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevold to approve the

tentative agenda. Motion carries. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 22, 2023 were read and approved with one correction.

Approve claims for payment. In open forum, Lerov Jensen discussed the tax rebates for Prestage and ReNewTrients. Jensen also asked about the Public Health building being renovated. Helgevold mentioned that renovation will be paid with ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) dollars and not taxpayer dollars.
