3) That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land in Wright County fail to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done and the expense of said work, including cost of serving notice and other costs, if any, to be assessed against the real estate

0) Wright County has reduced the Annual Spot Spraying Program of noxious weeds and other weed types growing in Wright County Secondary Road ditches. It will be the responsibility of each adjacent land owner, whose property adjoins the county road right of way to notify the Secondary Roads department of any noxious weed problems as they arise or deem worthy of inspection and control

Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, gave an update on secondary roads Clemons stated they are still working on mowing the side of roads on the granular routes. Dows zone #3 is 100% completed, Belmond zone #3 is 50% completed and Zone #1 is 33% completed. Trucks are still hauling the scheduled granular miles out of the Lesher/Meineke pit. Five work orders were also completed last week. Bridge #173 has had the pile cap replaced which is located on 120th Street over West Otter Creek in Section 17, Norway Township, C70 shouldering is completed and the crack sealing is completed on C54 and R75 and they have started the crack sealing on R33 north of Hwy #3. In addition, the pavement mark ings are completed on the southern half of the county.

Jav LeFevre with First Gabrielson Agency and other members of the Insurance Committee met with the Board to give the annual ICAP and IMWCA insurance renewal. Property rates continue to feel pressure up due to losses from large storms. ICAP has also increased property values due to inflation. The general liability and excess liability rates increased 5.5% due to cyber liability inclusion.

ICAP Property and Liability in-IMWCA creased \$22,575.00. workmans compensation increased \$1,353.00 from the prior year. IM-WCA - Experience mod decreased from .68 to .69; good experience credit increased from 20% to 25% and there were only two very small losses.
