May 20, 2024

Chairman Helgevoid called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoid.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the tentative agenda. Motion carries. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 13, 2024 were read and approved.

Approved claims for payment.

Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve Resolution 2024-17 to cancel outstanding warrants. By roll call vote: Ayes – Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoid; nays – none. Resolution 2024-17 duly passes and reads as follows:

Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve Resolution 2024-18 to accept financial responsibility, maintenance and operations for Trails in Wright County. This is a formality with the Iowa DOT requiring a new resolution that is over one year old. By roll call vote: Ayes – Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoid; nays – none. Resolution 2024-18 duly passes and reads as follows:

RESOLUTION 2024-18

RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT THE FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, MAINTENANCE, AND OPERATIONS FOR TRAILS IN WRIGHT COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Wright County Board of Supervisors has appointed a Wright County Trails committee to develop an interconnecting trail system as a method of recreation and mode for alternative transportation opportunity for the county and region;

WHEREAS, a trail system also provides quality of life amenities, economic opportunity, community interaction and tourism development for Wright County residents;

WHEREAS, the MIDAS Council of Governments was contracted by Wright County to research and develop a Master Trail System Plan for Wright County;

WHEREAS, 26 community members throughout Wright County assisted in the development and formulation of this plan with the MIDAS Council of Governments;

WHEREAS, the Midas Council of Governments presented the completed comprehensive trail plan overview to the Wright County Supervisors in a public meeting on June 18, 2018;

WHEREAS, the Wright County Conservation Board believes that it is in the best interest for the citizens of Wright County to accept the financial responsibilities of trail development, construction of, and maintenance of the Prairie Land Trail project and to maintain said project for the next 20 years

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wright County Conservation Board hereby has the authority to apply for grants for the development of, construction of and will accept the ownership and maintenance of the Prairie Land Trail system now and in the future; or any future trails developed within the Master Trails Plan; and shall accept any land or funds donated for future trail development projects within the county or be held in reserve by the Wright County Conservation Board for future trail development projects

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the Wright County Conservation Board may work with Individuals, Corporations, Non-Profit Organizations, County, State and Federal Agencies in trail development, maintenance and operations; jointly or as a whole to further future trail development projects

Approved this the 20th of May, 2024

Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, gave an update on the Secondary Roads. There were 22 work orders completed last week. Mowing of the hard surface roads is on schedule for Memorial Day weekend. The blade operators graded a total of 495.75 miles last week. Trucks continue to haul for the granular 2024 scheduled rock with 25 of 90 segments completed and completed spot loads when weather allowed.

Courtney Morris, Drainage Administrator, presented the 2024 Drainage Districts eligible to be spread per Iowa code 468.57 for no less than 10 and no more than 20 years. The board then reviewed and took action on the following 8 eligible districts spreading each of them per the Iowa code.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss, as Drainage District Trustees, to approve the 2024 Drainage District assessments eligible to be spread; 6 districts being spread for 10 years each, 1 district being spread for 15 years and 1 district being spread for 20 years each. Motion carries.

Kluss received a phone call over the weekend from the County Farm Tenant, Kevin Burres, regarding tile issues at the County Farm. Ryan Maasdam, with Maasdam Construction, completed the repairs. The Board may consider putting in more tile at the County Farm in the future.

Motion Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to adjourn the meeting. Motion carries.
