

PUBLIC NOTICE FOR ORDINANCE NO.186

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Goldfield, Iowa, will meet in the council chambers of the City Hall in Goldfield at 6:00 p.m. on November 12, 2024, to consider and act upon Ordinance No. 186, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 40 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF GOLDFIELD, IOWA, BY AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS RELATING TO PLANTING OF TREES, as follows:
Sections 40.3 and 40.8 of Chapter 40 CITY APPEARANCE of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Goldfield, Iowa (2014) are repealed and the following sections are adopted in lieu thereof:

40.3 PLANTING RESTRICTIONS. Effective immediately, no new trees shall be planted in any public street right of way or parking area, including the strip between the curb and the lot line of private property.
40.8 TREES SUBJECT TO REMOVAL. Whenever it is determined by the council that the health of the any trees within the city are threatened by disease or pests, including but not limited to Dutch elm disease and emerald ash borers, the public works superintendent may remove such living trees from any public street right of way or parking area, including the strip between the curb and the lot line of private property.
This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, posting and publication as required by law. By order of the City Council of the City of Goldfield, Iowa.

October 21, 2024

The Board of Supervisors met as Drainage District Trustees. To view the minutes from the drainage meeting, see the Drainage District minutes on the County website.
Chairman Helgevoid called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:08 a.m. Members present were Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoid. Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve the tentative agenda. Motion carries.
Minutes of the previous regular meeting of October 14, 2024 were read and approved.
Approved claims for payment.
Kluss spoke about the approved work to be done on the County Farm on July 29th to have three waterways shaped and the amount was not to exceed \$5,000. The claims came to \$4,500 with no seeding involved. Eric Rector, Wright County Conservation, and Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, discussed plans to install riprap and eco fabric to help with erosion control. The quote for the plans presented was \$1,800. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the amount not to exceed \$1,800 for erosion control on the three water-

ways at the County Farm. Motion carries.
Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve the third and final reading of Ordinance #69, an amendment to Ordinance #61, to continue the County Waterworks Enterprise in Wright County and establish rates in connection therewith. By roll call vote: Ayes – Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevoid; nays – none. The third and final reading of Ordinance #69 passes and will be effective after publication.

Clemons gave an update on the Secondary Roads. There were 11 work orders completed last week. Blade operators completed a ditch cleanout on Page Avenue north of C20. Truck operators continue to complete crack filling and are starting to inventory any culverts that are under 48" and under the road. Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to adjourn the meeting. Motion carries.
