Wright County Board of Supervisors

April 19, 2022 - Special Meeting

Chairman Rasmussen call the special meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 1:00 p.m. Members present were Rasmussen and Kluss with Helgevoold present via ZOOM.

Also present in the meeting were: Isaac Risseeuw with 3B Inspection, Kylie Kretz, Pipeline Project Manager, Summit Carbon Solutions and Bill Sullivan, Project Manager with Turnkey Logistics.

Secondary Roads – Adam Clemons, Nathan McVey, and Jeremy Abbas. Citizens – Bob Ritter, Richard Hocraffer, and Gary Olson. Auditor staff Courtney Morris and Betty Ellis.

The special meeting was to discuss with Summit Carbon Solutions the Secondary Roads crossing. Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer started the meeting with some of the permits and agreements that Summit may be required to obtain from their department. The first was a Road Use Agreement that would designate oversized and/or overweight loads. Kretz stated that there would be very few over weight loads and may be a few oversized. Clemons also requested that with this agreement that there will need to be a map showing haul routes.

Clemons also brought up about Iowa Code Section 320.4 and is waiting on clarification from the County Attorney on this code.

The third item Clemons brought up was the work in the Right of Way permit. Some items this permit would require is: detailed drawing per each crossing, cross only at a

90 degree angle, detailed as built and elevation drawings, required to be bored under the road (no cut through), registering with 811, and placing identifying markers at each crossing.

Bill Sullivan with Turnkey Logistics asked a few questions?

1. If they follow previous pipeline easements if they still have to cross at 90 degrees if the previous pipeline is not? (not sure if that will happen in Wright County)

2. How long the permit is good for? Most are 1 year with start work within 90 days.

3. Will they need a driveway permit or temporary access permit?

4. 130 to 160 working days in most cases working 6 days a week.

5. What Insurance minimum is required?

6. Is there restricted hours of work or daylight hours? No ordinance in Wright County but must use proper lighting and signage.

7. Does the county have the width of all the roads Right of Ways?

8. Zoning map?

9. For entrance permits is there a site distance?

10. Noise Ordinance?

11. Flood plain map?

Kylie Kretz with Summit Carbon Solutions did say that it will be coming out soon the property tax dollars that Counties will get from the Pipeline. It is estimated that Wright County will get \$2.5 million in property tax dollars.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Helgevoold to adjourn the meeting. Motion carries.
