OCTOBER 4, 2021 CHAIRMAN HELGEVOLD CALLED THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE WRIGHT COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO ORDER AT 9:00 A.M. MEMBERS PRESENT WERE KLUSS, RASMUSSEN AND HELGEVOLD.

Minutes from the previous regular meeting of September 27, 2021, special meeting of September 29, 2021 and special meeting of October 1, 2021 were read and approved.

Approved claims for payment. In open forum, Steven Smith spoke about rental properties in Clarion, Iowa.

Sandy McGrath with Wright County Public Health gave an update on the COVID cases in Wright County. There are 71 new positive cases since last week with a total of 2,333 positive cases since March 2020. A total of 51% of Wright County Residents have been fully vaccinated.

Wright County Public Health will be setting up clinics in local churches with COVID vaccines and 3rd dose booster shots. Opened up the bids for the cash rent of the Wright County Farm southeast of Clarion. There were 7 bids submitted and they are as follows:

Kendrick Sunken, Belmont: \$275.00/acre, with 1st payment in March and 2nd payment in November.

Kevin Burres, Eagle Grove: \$328.24/acre Grant Stein, Eagle Grove: \$292.00/acre Greg Schipull, Goldfield: \$280.00/acre

Southerland Farms, Blairsburg: \$310.00/acre Nick Christensen, Goldfield: \$290.00/acre

Troy & Heidi Watne, Belmont: \$351.00/acre, with 1st payment in May and 2nd payment in December.

Motion by Kluss and seconded by Rasmussen to approve award bid to Troy and Heidi Watne at \$351.00/acre for 262 acres provided they are willing to comply with the lease which states one payment each year. Motion carries.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve Resolution 2021-30 on directing the filing of Certification of Debt in the Agribusiness Urban Renewal TIF Area. By roll call vote: Ayes - Kluss, Rasmussen, and Helgevold; nays - none. Resolution 2021-30 duly passes and reads as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-30 RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE FILING OF CERTIFICATION UNDER IOWA CODE SECTION 403.19

WHEREAS, the County of Wright, State of Iowa has established the Agribusiness Urban Renewal Area (the «Urban Renewal Area») and is undertaking certain projects within the Urban Renewal Area (the «Project(s)); and

WHEREAS, the County has incurred indebtedness and advanced funds for the cost of one or more Projects; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the County to certify the amount so incurred and advanced, together with interest, for reimbursement under Iowa Code Section 403.19.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Wright, State of Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. There has been established the Agribusiness Urban Renewal Area Tax Incremental Revenue Fund (the «Tax Incremental Fund»), into which all incremental property tax revenues received from the Urban Renewal Area are deposited. The Board finds the Projects to be Urban Renewal Projects as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 403 and has followed the proceedings for the urban renewal area.

Agribusiness Infrastructure loan at Green Belt Bank & Trust additional \$600,000 Interest paid on Agribusiness infrastructure (GB B&T) of \$47,476 Interest on Agribusiness infrastructure per payment schedule \$114,839

Interest paid on Agribusiness land purchase (FSB) to date of \$52,520 Interest on Agribusiness land purchase per payment schedule \$17,910

Prestage tax rebate \$728,992 Projects: 2019-2020 already certified: Interest paid on Agribusiness land purchase to date of \$87,186.66

Projects: 2018-2019 already certified: Balance of SRF Loan Principal of \$41,980 for Sewer Project Interest on SRF per payment schedule of \$812,583 Balance of Revenue Bonds Principal of \$245,000 Interest on Revenue Bonds per payment schedule of \$315,112 Interest on GO Bond for R.I.S.E. Road Project per payment schedule of \$65,503.33

Land Purchase loan from Security Bank for Agribusiness Park of \$1,600,000 Infrastructure loan from Green Belt Trust for Agribusiness Park of \$800,000 Projects: 2017-2018 already certified: State Revolving Fund (SRF) Principal of \$4,000,000 for Sewer Project Revenue Bonds Principal of \$1,000,000 for Eagle Grove Community School Capital Fund General Obligation Bond Principal of \$440,000 for R.I.S.E. Road project for turning lanes and road improvement.

Section 2. The Auditor and other County officials having responsibility for the books and records of the County shall take such actions as are necessary to comply with this Resolution, including but not limited to, certification for reimbursement under Iowa Code Section 403.19.

ADOPTED AND PASSED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WRIGHT, STATE OF IOWA, this 4th day of October, 2021.

Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, gave an update on the Secondary Roads. Crews are currently mowing Zone 3 of gravel road ditches. There were 29 work orders completed last week. Bridge 105, Bridge to Culvert is completed with a total cost of the project being \$53,870.86. A large portion of the cost was for pipes totaling \$37,000.00.

Auditor Ellis presented a letter that will be handed out to all county employees explaining that ISAC will now be enforcing their policy for all counties within their health insurance plan that states the health insurance coverage will end the last day of the month that the employment ends. The county will make the change in collection of employee premiums to comply with ISAC effective January 2022.

Nick Willwerth spoke about his concern with a daycare closure in Eagle Grove due to positives COVID-19 cases. The board asked that Mr. Willwerth speak to the Board of Health in voicing his concerns.

Held Joint Drainage District public hearing with Franklin County to discuss the Appraiser's Report on damage claims for Drainage District 118-4. Wright County Supervisor Rasmussen motioned to open the public hearing, seconded by Franklin County Supervisor Vanness. Gallentine presented JDD 4-118 Appraisers' Report for damage claims as a result of the repairs and improvements to Main Tile and Lateral 2 tile.
